

Teaching Styles Are Changing With The Times

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This study sought to explore how college faculty think about effective teaching methods and strategies. Data was collected through interviews, surveys and observation of classes, to examine the integration of teaching and learning styles in the classroom. Surveys were sent to twenty members of the college faculty. The results of the data showed that the faculty knew of and employed many effective teaching strategies. Findings of this study suggest that the majority of college professors surveyed were aware of the variety of learning patterns of today's students, used a variety of methods to stay current in their field, and incorporated numerous assessment techniques. 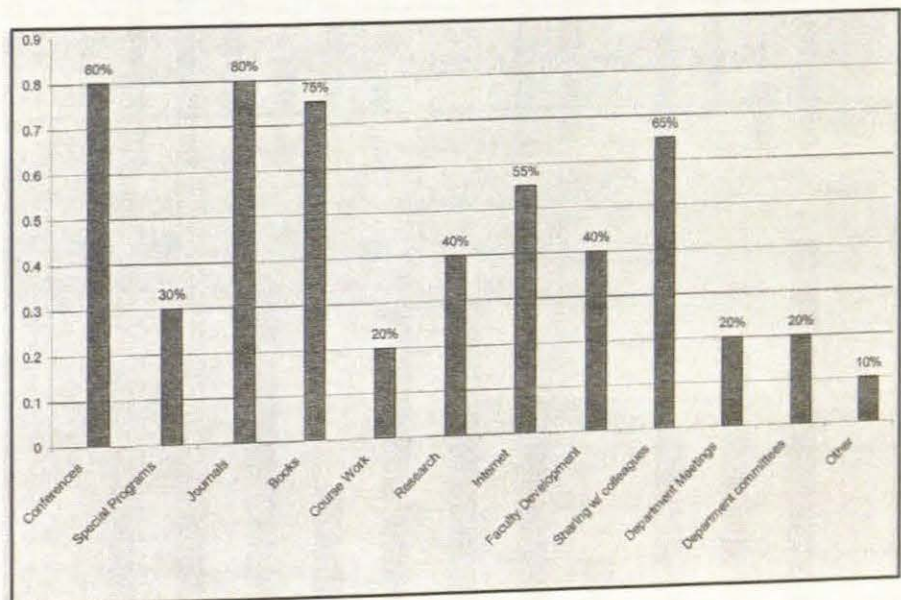


Figure 2. Teaching methods used by the college professors

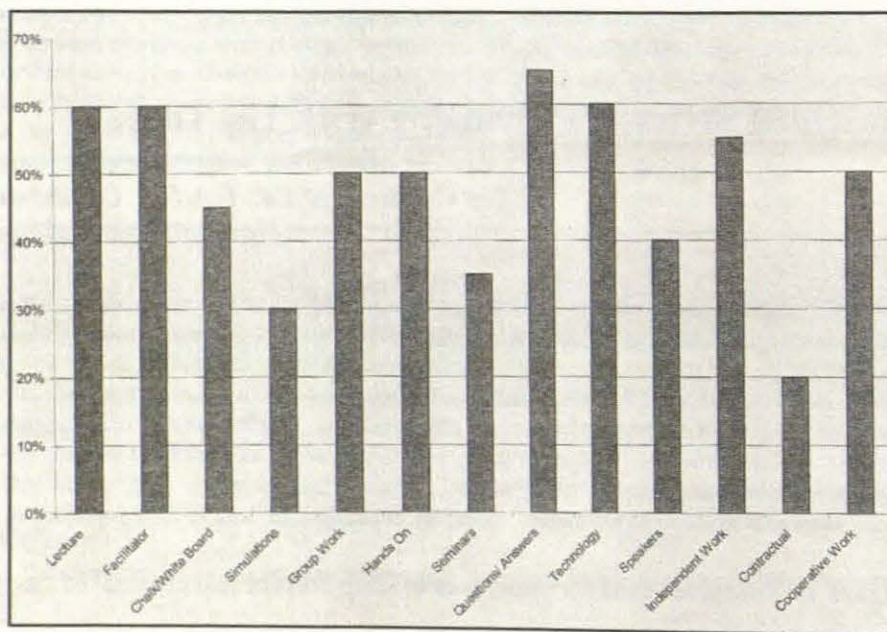


Figure 3. Curriculum materials used in the classroom

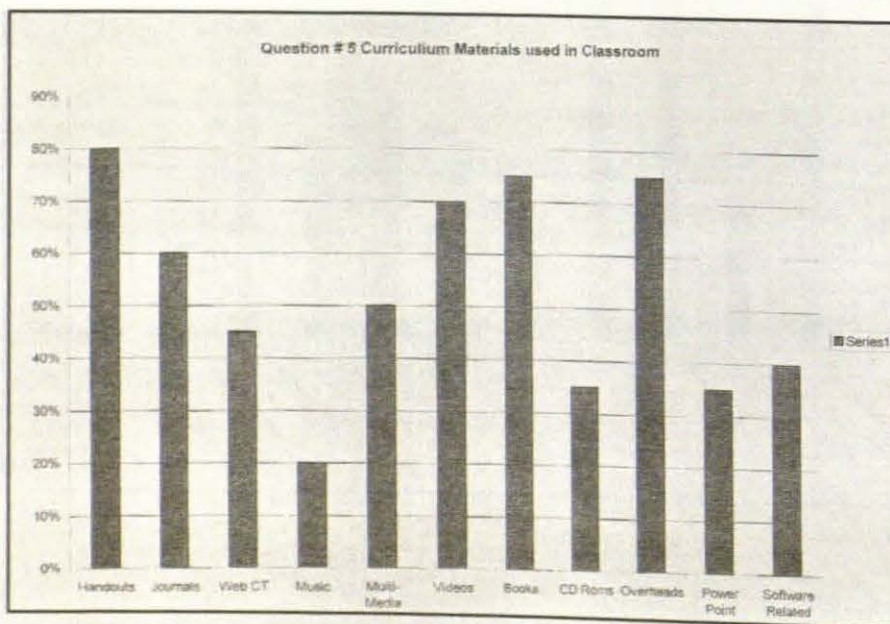


Figure 4. Most widely used assessment tools used by the college faculty
